“ *In re CHARLES E GREEN Sr.: I confer my deepest and heartfelt condolences to the Family of my dear friend, Brother Charles E. Green Sr (or maybe the III'd as he believed growing up). We were the best of friends for 47 years, beginning in 1977 (at Cornell University), through his recent demise in 2024 (in Virginia).*

Charles, the first Son (but third child) of his Mom (Wilven Green), must be commended for earning her enduring trust by routinely exhibiting a level head and astute financial ability. Charles' assiduous attention to the well-being of his entire Family (including his Siblings: Patricia, Shirley and Michael) was apparent early-on to her, and notable to all those who knew him.

I recall Charles' glee upon meeting the woman who would become the love of his life and ultimately his wife, Yackie. His preference early-on focused on the fair-skinned Puerto Rican women he liked to attract, but quickly changed upon his discovery that the one from Panama was more exceptional, loving, and equally level-headed. The union with Yackie produced Charles' son, Charles Jr. (or maybe the IV'th), who would become my beloved Godson (whom Charles and Yackie have already set on a positive trajectory).

Charles' tour of life led him first to Brooklyn College, then on to join the armed forces with the New York Army National Guard. When his unit disbanded, he transferred to the U.S. National Guard for over twenty years, then into the active weekend National Guard Reserve. On the civil side, Charles became employed with the New York Department of Sanitation for a long and event-filled tour serving his own Brooklyn neighborhood, where he met and created lasting friendships with fellow Sanitation workers (who were able to retire early and enjoy lifelong lucrative pension benefits). [I think I slightly remember that Charles' Sanitation route had something to do with his discovery of Yackie!] While carefully handling his employment obligations with both Sanitation and the National Guard, Charles found time to travel numerous to Los Angeles (where I live) for warm West Coast relaxation that included several drives to Las

Vegas (for Concerts and title Boxing matches), and even a trip once into Mexico to find whatever! We had great times ... even that one time Charles flew out here and interrupted my training for the New York City Marathon. He assuaged my preparation by accompanying me on a pick-up 20-mile Run that he gleefully completed (with his Army boot-camp training where Charles might have been a Sergeant). We talked about him pulling off that grueling Run for YEARS thereafter!

For the nearly half-Century that Charles and I have shared a friendship, I shall remain forever grateful for his memory and legacy. May God bless his hearty bold Soul (which I know rests now in Heaven)!
