DENNIS JAMES MOSLEY was born on October 13, 1963 to Carrie Mosley in Brooklyn, New York. He was a proud and devoted son, brother, uncle, cousin and friend. He attended P.S. 260 and Bildersee Junior High School before graduating from Eli Whitney High School in 1981. Upon graduating, he took to Wall Street, working as a runner for the New York Stock Exchange. He also worked at Lehman Brothers. pragmatic, expressing his love through what he did for his family and friends. He could be counted on for anything.

After over twenty six years of dedicated service, Dennis moved on from his work with the MTA and returned to Brooklyn to care for his mother. He stayed by her side through his own health issues. Surrounded by love and his family, he returned home to the Lord on January 7th, 2016.
