Joezell M. Brabham was born in Bamberg, South Carolina on October 2, 1927 to the late Malcolm and Ida Kearsse Brabham.

On February 13, 1946 Joezell enlisted into the United States Army where he served his country as a Duty Solider. Joezell fought in World War II and earned a victory medal.

Joezell migrated to Brooklyn, New York in the late 1940's. There he met the love of his life Betty Jean Harshaw (whom preceded him in death). On April 5, 1953 they were united in marriage. Joezell worked for Kirsch Beverages as a high low driver until his retirement.

Hennessey). They would sit, talk and he would find something to fuss at Andy about but Andy never took it to heart, he just sat there and let it rip.
