To know him was to pray with him and be encouraged by him. Malik was raised in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn, in a home that was defined by infinite family love and togetherness. On August 2, 1991, Malik developed a new dimension of his being when his family moved to Laurelton, Queens. He attended Springfield Gardens High School and graduated in 1994.
